## **ONLINE BILL PAY & PAPERLESS BILLING**

For your convenience, you can now visit www.schererville.org and pay your water bill on line. Just click on Pay Water Bill on line. You can choose to do a one-time pay or register. There are several benefits to registering for online billing including the ability to check previous invoices, the option to go paperless, it offers an easier way to store information, and of course gives you the ability to pay anytime from anywhere.

Another option is the Direct Withdrawal Program. If you forget to pay your water bill, a common mistake, there's no need to worry when you are registered for the automatic withdraw program. Your payment will be automatically withdrawn from a checking account of your specification on the 24th of every month. This program takes the hassle right out of the process. There's no more check to write, no need to call and pay over the phone, and no rushing to Town Hall to pay that bill that always seems to slip your mind. When enrolled in the Direct Withdrawal Program, you will still receive your water bill as usual but it will be marked with Direct withdrawal - do not send payment. Bank information is securely maintained.

## **SUMMER SEWER RATES**

From the time your water meter is read in the beginning of May to the time it is read in the beginning of September, residents receive a discount on their sewer rates known as Summer Sewer Rates. An average household uses 2,000 gallons of water per person each month. If two people live in the house they should use approximately 4,000 gallons of water per month. During Summer Sewer Rates if they use 10,000 gallons of water, they are only charged for 4,000 gallons of sewage, but still pay for the 10,000 gallons of water that were used. If you plan on filling your pool or hot tub before May 1st or after September 1st, please read your water meter before and after usage, and call the readings into the Clerk-Treasurer's Office: (219) 322-2211 Ext. 5

# **TOUCH A TRUCK**


