ANIMAL CONTROL

Whenever the weather turns hot, don't leave your pets in the car. Even if the temperature outside is only 70 degrees, the inside of your car can reach 100 degrees after 20 minutes. On an 85- degree day, it only takes 10 minutes for the inside of your car to reach 104 degrees. Within 30 minutes, the car's interior can climb from 85 degrees to 120 degrees. Pets most at risk for overheating are young, elderly or overweight animals, those with short muzzles and those with thick or dark-colored coats. Dogs left in a hot car can suffer from heatstroke. Some signs of heatstroke are:

- Rapid panting
- Bright red tongue
- Red or pale gums
- Thick, sticky saliva
- Depression
- Weakness
- Dizziness
- Vomiting sometimes with blood
- Diarrhea
- Shock
- Coma

CONSERVATION

There is a worsening trend in water supply nationwide. It is up to the consumer to change the way water is used. There are several ways to practice water conservation in your home. Not only will home water conservation practices save money but will also benefit the greater good of the community. For the most part, the water saving methods outlined below require little to no cost to you.

In general, keep an eye on your water bill. If you have an increase in usage, you may need to investigate if you have a leak. If you do not see any visible leaks, a simple dye test on your toilet(s) is always a good place to start. Dye tabs to check your toilets are available for pick up at the Town of Schererville Clerk Treasurer's Office or you can simply use regular food coloring.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO CONSERVE WATER:

- Check all faucets, pipes, and toilets for visible leaks.
- Take shorter showers. Using a kitchen timer is an easy way to control shower watering a garden or for cleaning. times.
- It is very low cost to retrofit your home using simple methods such as low-flow showerheads, tank banks to displace water in the toilet tank, and faucet aerators. Ultra-low flush toilets are an option also.
- Do not use your toilet as a wastebasket. Reduce the amount of flushes when possible, and throw trash in the wastebasket.
- · While brushing teeth or shaving, turn off the water when appropriate.
- Fully load the dishwasher and if washing dishes by hand set up a rinse side of the

sink or rinse in a pan of clean water.

- Wash full loads of clothes in the washer.
- Install a rain barrel to collect water for
- Do not overwater your landscaping.
- Water your lawn and outdoor plants in the early morning or in the evening. Less water is needed and will reduce evaporation. In addition, aim sprinklers on the grass, not the sidewalk or driveway where it will just run off. Your garden hose can disperse 600 or more gallons in only a few hours, so use a timer to remind yourself to turn it off or to rotate sprinklers.
- Check all hoses and outside spigots regularly for leaks.
- Check the setting on irrigation systems. Make sure timing devices are properly working and that you have a rain sensor installed.
- Set your mower blades a notch higher. Longer grass means less evaporation and deeper root growth leaving grass that requires less water than if it is clipped short.
- · Do not put water down the drain that can be used elsewhere, such as
- Do not thaw frozen food with running water. Instead use the refrigerator or the defrost setting on the microwave.
- If you have a well for your home, make sure the pump is not kicking on when water is not in use. If it does, you have a
- · Create awareness with your children. It's never too late to practice good habits of using water responsibly.

By implementing some of these water conservation tips, you have the opportunity to reduce your use, your costs and benefit your community.

Public Works Reminders

Annual Sprinkler System Backflow Testing

Backflow prevention devices stop the backflow of potentially contaminated water into the domestic water supply. The Indiana Dept. of Environmental Management (IDEM) and the Schererville Water Dept. regulations require these devices to be tested annually by a State of Indiana Certified Backflow Prevention Device Inspector. Test results are to be submitted either by fax or email.

Hydrant Flushing

Every summer the Schererville Water Department personnel conduct fire hydrant testing to ensure the hydrants are in good working order and to flush out any rust accumulation. If you see Water Department crews testing hydrants near your home you can expect to see a slight discoloration in your water. There is no need to be alarmed. This is a temporary and harmless discoloration from small amounts of rust in the water. Running the water in your home will help flush out your water line, and is recommended before washing any light colored clothing.

Recycling & Hazardous Waste

Do you have an old TV to dispose of? Check out the Lake County Solid Waste Management District's website at LCSWMD.com for their Electronic Recycling locations. The Hazardous Waste schedule is also posted with a list as to what they will accept and where the collections will be held.

Grass Clippings

Grass clippings can go out with your trash (not recycling). Please keep lawn bags dry and weighing 40 pounds or less.


Branch Pickup
