* **Theft From Vehicle** - Complainant came to the PD to report theft of her purse while she was at Chapel Lawn on 9/23/22. Complainant stated that the theft occurred between noon and 1 P.M. from her unlocked vehicle.

* **Suspicious Person** – I was dispatched to the area of SAINT ANDREWS DR & TURNBERRY DR in reference to a suspicious male subject asking passerby motorists for a ride. Officer's arrived and checked the area and was unable to locate any persons of interest. Officers were flagged down by the caller whom stated that the male had left the area along with a female in a smaller Toyota Tacoma style pickup truck. I then notified the front gate security of the call and vehicle that was possibly involved.

Sharing the Road Safely with School Buses.

- Never pass a bus from behind if it is stopped to load or unload children.
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough to allow them space to safely enter and exit.
- Be alert; children are often unpredictable, and tend to ignore hazards and take risks.

Ordinance of the Week:

Sec. 8-83 Stop When Traffic Obstructed.

No driver shall enter an intersection or a marked crosswalk unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk to accommodate the vehicle he is operating without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians, notwithstanding any traffic control signal indication to proceed.
