The Schererville Police Department will be hosting its thirteenth summer "Cop Camp" for kids ages 10-13. There is no fee for the camp which will run from Tuesday July 26th through July 29th from 10am – 1:00pm with lunch and snacks provided.

The "Campers" will have the opportunity to tour the police station, meet with officers and get hands on training in collection of evidence, firearms through a big video game device, as well as, seeing a K-9 and swat demonstration.

The camp application process will start on Monday June 14th, 2022. This camp will be offered to our Schererville children who complete and return the application prior to Friday July 15th, 2022 at 5pm. Class size is limited with a minimum of 6.

Please understand that this camp fills up quickly and is on a first come first serve basis. Class size cannot exceed 20 enrolled campers.

* I received a call in reference to a suspicious incident in the area of 2815 Autumn Drive. Southcom advised the complainant could hear a female screaming "help" from in the direction of the park. Contact was made with this female, who identified and she advised she was yelling help because she locked her keys in her car.

* I responded to Saint George Dr. in reference to a theft that occurred over the weekend. Upon arrival I met with the complainant who stated that someone stole his spare tire that was attached under his Dodge that was parked in his driveway.

While on scene a neighboring resident stated that a quarter tank of gas was removed from his vehicle as well. He believes the theft of his gasoline occurred Thursday or Friday night.

* Churchill Dr. - Suspicious red Ford Econoline van in the area. I located the vehicle and made contact with the registered owner who advised his battery died. He got a ride home from his son and will return later this afternoon with a new battery and remove the vehicle.

* St. George Dr. - I responded to a suspicious incident. Upon arrival I met with the complainant who stated that on 6/9/2022 at 10:18 PM his Ring camera picked up a suspicious incident. The recorded footage showed what looked like 4 teenagers walking south on the side walk when one of the teens ran up to R/P's front door and knocks several times and runs off. In the video you can hear someone calling the kid who ran up to the door "Josh".





- * We responded to a report of a juvenile damaging a fence near W 77th Ave and Patterson Dr. Upon my arrival, I observed a broken section of a fence at 2515 Tate Dr. I first spoke with the complainant/witness who stated that she was pulling into her garage when she observed a juvenile run into the side of the fence, removing multiple panels. The R/P stated that the vehicle contained three occupants, and described them as three white juvenile males with long hair. The R/P described the vehicle as a dark colored Honda sedan. The R/P advised that she lost sight of the vehicle near Lake Central High School. The R/P stated that she then returned to the scene to speak with officers.
- * We were dispatched to a report of juveniles damaging a fence at the above address. I arrived on scene and spoke with the homeowner at 2406 Medelene-Grace Ct,. She advised that her neighbor witnessed the incident. The R/P advised that he observed a juvenile male white with long hair exit a silver Nissan passenger car and run toward the callers fence. The neighbor stated that the juvenile then began kicking the fence. The neighbor also stated that there were three white male juveniles in the vehicle, all with long hair. We checked the area of the fence in which the juvenile was kicking and observed no damage to the fence.
- * We were dispatched to Maple pl. to investigate a bullet hole in the garage. On arrival, the complainant states someone shot her house last night. I examined the hole, and could see that a woodpecker or unknown critter made the hole in the wood siding. I patched the hole from the inside with industrial tape, and advised the complainant that wood putty and paint would be needed.
- * On 6-11-22 I responded to Protsman Dr. in reference to a suspicious incident. Upon my arrival I spoke to the Complainant who stated that as she was walking home she overheard 2 possible juveniles speaking to an older male subject. The R/P said that she overheard the male subject ask the 1 of the 3 juveniles what her tx number was and if her mother monitored her text messages. The R/P said that the possible juvenile was wearing a tie dye shirt like the fest workers at the Schererville Fest. The R/P said that she advised the girl not to give the male subject her number and it was not a good idea to talk to him. The R/P said that the girl told her to mind her own business and she left walking S/B Protsman Dr. The R/P said that the male subject got into a white truck down the road and left the area. The R/P said that she just wanted the police to be aware if case we had any more calls about the male subject. I checked the area for any juvenile walking and for the truck and was unable to locate either.

Summer Safety Tips from the Schererville Police Department

With the majority of schools being out and the summer upon us, residents are encouraged to follow these important summer safety tips:

- **Talk with your kids about strangers** and make sure that they are near you at all times. You are also discouraged from allowing young children to wander around town by themselves. For older children who may require less supervision, make sure that they are traveling, jogging, or hanging out in groups. 58% of abductions are teenagers.
- **If you attend a party and choose to consume alcohol**, make sure that you select a designated driver who will not consume alcohol to drive you home safely.
- **If you go on vacation, make sure to let your trusted neighbors know along with the Schererville Police Department's Records Division at 219-322-5000.** Encourage your neighbors to report anything suspicious on your property. Make your home look as if someone is there by using dusk to dawn, motion-detecting, and timed lighting and if possible, as a neighbor to park in your driveway/mow your lawn if possible.
- **Adults should also always walk, jog, or bike with friends for safety purposes.** Keep an eye on your personal property and that of your neighbors and report suspicious activity immediately by calling 911.

Town Dump Hours and Use

The Town of Schererville Dump is located at 540 Kaeser Blvd.

Hours are as follows:

- Monday thru Friday 7am to 3pm. &
- May through November the first Saturday of the month, 8am to 12pm.

The following are regulations for using the dump facilities:

- The town dump is only intended for a small amount of household waste on an occasional basis.
- Users must be a Town of Schererville resident, ID must be shown.
- No construction debris will be allowed.
- No electronics
- No paint, oil, gas, aerosols, solvents, stain, adhesives, pesticides etc.
- No asphalt
- No concrete
- No shingles
- No hazardous waste
- Limit of 1 pickup truck will be allowed per household with a maximum of 1 cubic yard.

Failure to comply with all of these regulations shall result in citations, fines, and permanent revocation of dumping privileges.

* **Fireworks Town Ordinance:** (Time of Use) A person may utilize Consumer Fireworks and Section 6-66(a) Fireworks on the following specific days, and no other, without a special permit as follows:

1. between 5:00 p.m. and two (2) hours after sunset on June 29, June 30, July 1, July 2, July 3, July 5, July 6, July 7, July 8, and July 9;
2. between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight on July 4; and
3. between the hours of 10:00 a.m. on December 31 and 1:00 a.m. on January 1.
