

REPORTS

* I received a call in reference to a damaged mailbox on Janice Drive. On arrival I met and spoke with the property manager who advised she wanted to make a report. I observed heavy damaged to the mailboxes, which contained boxes for all the units and was larger in size. Contact was made with the owner of a white Hyundai Santa Fe who had damage to the passenger side fender. I spoke to that vehicle owner who admitted to striking the mailbox Wednesday night. Both parties agreed to handle it civilly with some sort of monthly payment added to each months rent. The mailbox was estimated at approximately \$3,100, not including labor costs to install it.

*Officers were dispatched to a report of a loud noise outside of the residence on Deerpath Dr W. Officers arrived and spoke with the complainant advised that around 5 minutes prior to calling he heard what sounded like someone throwing something at the side of the house. Officers checked the perimeter of the house and found no damage or signs of such an incident.

* Officers were dispatched for a parking problem. On Knoxbury Ln. Upon arrival, the complainant reported the listed Hyundai was parked in his driveway blocking him from being able to pull out from his garage. A query on the vehicle's plate, showed the vehicle was registered out of Highland In. The vehicle owner came out of a near by unit and moved the vehicle. The vehicle owner was cited for improper parking, blocking a driveway.



Our Town Ordinance on removing cans from the curb after garbage pick-up.

The property owner shall not place such recyclable container or containers for collection at such collection location before 6:00 p.m. the day before scheduled collection.

The homeowner shall remove their garbage cans from the curb before dusk on the day of collection, or as soon thereafter on said collection date as is practical.

In no event shall the property owner leave the recyclable container or garbage cans at the curb overnight on the day of collection if collection has been made as scheduled.



- * Burlwood Ln. - Complainant reported 5 loud knocks on the front window. I advised at the same time I observed fireworks going off. The area was checked and no suspicious activity was observed.
- * Deerpath West. - I was advised of someone blowing up loud fireworks at the listed location on 6-21-22 at around 10pm. I spoke with the homeowner who advised that it was him. He was advised of the dates and times that he is allowed to use fireworks. He advised that he understood.
- * On 6-22-22 I assisted officers with taking a suspect into custody wanted by our PD in reference to a shooting. K9 Bosco was deployed around the back of the house for officer protection. Officer's made contact with the suspect and he was taken into custody without incident.
- * Protsman Dr. - Officers were dispatched to Protsman in reference to fireworks. On arrival, Officers located the fireworks and issued the father a written warning for using fireworks.
- * Morningside Dr. – Officers were dispatched to the area of Morningside Dr and Demeter reference fireworks going off in the area. Upon arrival, it was determined there was a small party at the above mentioned location and they were cleaning up fireworks. I spoke with the homeowner and advised her of the town ordinance regarding firework usage. The homeowner was issued a warning. The homeowner advised they were done for the night and were setting them off for her daughters birthday.
- * I was advised on an Illinois plated vehicle, sitting in the driveway of the above residence, expired. Upon arrival, contact was not made with the vehicle/home owner. A parking notice was left on the vehicle for review on Indiana Code 9-18.1-2-6, out of state parking violation.
- * Balkan Dr. - I responded to a report of unknown subjects walking around the residence. The homeowner stated they saw on their Ring doorbell 2 subjects approach the door and it appeared they spat on the camera. They were observed on video walking towards the side of the house. The exterior of the home checked secure and nothing suspicious was found. The subjects were described as 2 younger male blacks, possibly teens. 1 was wearing a white shirt and 1 a yellow shirt. No one matching that description was found in the area.
- * Naples Dr. & Capri Dr. - Officers were dispatched to a report of a male subject walking with a clipboard in his hands near Naples Dr and Capri Dr. Officers arrived on scene and spotted the individual walking near Naples Dr and Genoa Ct. Officers spoke with the juvenile subject, L.J. L.J. advised that he was asking for money toward a college fund. Officers advised L.J. that doing so was in violation of a Schererville Town Ordinance. L.J. was advised that if he continued to do so he would be issued a citation for soliciting. L.J. called for a ride and was released from the scene. Nothing further to report at this time.



- * Officers arrived on scene and spoke with the complainant's son who advised that a white male subject was knocking loudly on the front door of the residence for approximately fifteen minutes. The complainant stated that the male appeared to be holding a package. He advised that prior to our arrival, the male entered a black Volvo sedan and left the scene.

Ordinance of the Week:

Sec. 8-80 Stop Signs.

When stop signs are erected upon streets intersecting a through street at the entrances thereto or at the entrance to any intersection designated in the Town's "Traffic Control Devices" Schedule in § 8-86, every driver of a vehicle shall **stop** at every sign or at a clearly marked **stop** line before entering the intersection.


