DAV Walk in Schererville deemed 'most successful to date'



Dozens of people of all ages gathered on Saturday, August 23 to participate in the 4th Annual St. John Township Walk for Disabled Veterans co-hosted by the Town of Schererville. Hammond-based DAV Chapter #17 and St. John Township Trustee Cathy J. Lareau.

"The event honors U.S. Military veterans who suffered disabilities while actively serving our country, Lareau said about the DAV Walk that began with opening ceremonies at

the St. John Township Veterans Memorial located in front of the Schererville Police Department then proceded to the nearby 9/11 Memorial where the walk stepped off.

"DAV is dedicated to a single purpose -- empowering the USA military service veterans to lead high quality lives with respect and dignity," she said.

"It was a wonderful event and the most successful walk to date," said Lareau. "There was so much support from our community, from those who sponsored, participated, donated and those who volunteered."

Lareau added, "This walk had the highest amount of money raised and the highest number of participants. I am so thankful and honored to be able to partner with both the Town of Schererville and DAV Chapter #17 to provide this walk for our veterans. There was a Special Recognition of Military in attendance who had served or are currently serving. We expressed our deep gratitude to all of them for not only serving our Country but for serving all of us there that day."

The opening ceremony included a moment of silence honoring Aaron Amptmeyer who had recently passed away from a medical emergency. He was both a Detective of St. John Police Department and Commander of Northwest Regional SWAT Team.

The moment of silence was led by Schererville Police Chief Sormaz.

The ceremony concluded with TAPS by Carlos Lara and Alex Ehlebracht, a Lake Central High School band member.

Lunch was served by

veteran-owned The Cheesy Truck. Adventure Club provided carnival games for children, and music was provided by Joe Cantafio.

"The funds raised by the DAV Walk go directly to help disabled veterans in our area," Lareau said, "The DAV will help disabled veterans monetarily with bills. They will also connect veterans with a service officer to help file for benefits through the Veterans Administration."

She added, "Every year someone reaches out who didn't realize they could receive benefits from the VA."
