'Never Forget'

On Thursday, September 11, Schererville's 9-11 Memorial service will remember and honor those who died, those who served and those who carry on 24 years after the tragedy that united our nation.

People of all ages are invited to gather from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the town's 9-11 Memorial, located at the corner of Junction Street and Joliet Street near the Schererville Police Department, to walk around the memorial and remember the lives lost on September 11, 2001.

"Never Forget serves as a way to remember and honor the lives lost on 9/11," said Schererville Police Chief Peter Sormaz. This year's memorial service will include members of the 9-11 Committee, Schererville police officers and Schererville firefighters.

"The Schererville 9-11 Memorial has continued to grow," Chief Sormaz said. "The beam, which is from the Twin Towers in New York City, was erected in 2013. It was donated to the Town of Schererville by the New York Port Authority in 2011."

The memorial's two representative Twin Towers were erected in 2017 with the help of numerous contributions, Chief Sormaz noted, adding, "Each light that shines from the towers' beams represent one of the 2,977 lives lost on that tragic day."

A concrete handicap-accessible sidewalk was constructed around the 9-11 Memorial in 2022 to allow visitors to view the memorial from all sides, he said.

In addition, the 9-11 Memorial's location at the corner of Junction Street and Joliet Street near the Pennsy Greenway Trailhead provides easy access for those who wish to visit the memorial.



Schererville Police Department Citizens Police Academy seeks participants! Fall Session 2025

The Schererville Police Department Citizens Academy provides an opportunity for community members to experience what it is like to be a Schererville Police Officer and is returning in 2025. The academy is designed for attendees to meet police officers and learn about their assignments, specialties, and daily operations. It provides the opportunities to learn firsthand what it is like to be a police officer.

The academy will meet on Mondays beginning September 15, 2025, for 6 weeks concluding with a graduation ceremony October 20, 2025. Classes will begin each Monday night at 6 pm to 9 pm. All classes will take place at the Schererville Police Department in the Town Court Room.

All classes are FREE/COMPLIMENTARY and include all class materials, T-shirts and refreshments. Opportunities may arise for BONUS days such as simulators and off-site facilities.

There are several topics featured throughout the program including presentations on all agency divisions, training, public information, drone team, crash investigation, evidence collection, K9 unit, traffic enforcement and many more.

Our academy is a "hands on" interactive approach in which each student gets to participate in activities that prove to both educational and WE HAVE FUN!

There will also be an opportunity to tour the police facility, to ride along with a patrol officer, and discuss current issues such as use of force, pursuit policies and evidence collection.

The academy will offer citizens an opportunity to see how their police department works and what new technologies it has to offer. This is our way of reaching out to the community and helping build lasting relationships that will benefit everyone involved.

Class size is limited to 20 students. Applications can be picked up in our records division from 8 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday. The deadline is Monday, September 8, 2025. Once the students of the academy graduate, they become eligible to apply for our Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) program.

Application and driver's license are required. To be considered for this year's class must be at least 18 years of age, and have your interest submitted no later than September 8, 2025.
